As a member of Manchester Camerata, you will perform an exciting range of repertoire to an incredibly high level locally, nationally and internationally and have the opportunity to be part of our Camerata in the Community work through creative music making. As such, we've included an optional improvisation element to the audition process, and we'd encourage you to explore this way of working with our members as part of this process.

In 2023 we offered approximately 90 days of work to string members. Please note depending on the concert programme and repertoire members are not always required for all concerts.



How To Apply

Application and audio/visual submission deadline:

Monday 15th April 2024

Second-Round Live Audition date:

Monday 10th June 2024, Manchester, venue TBC

Manchester Camerata has a commitment to diversity in its programming, staffing and community engagement, and actively seeks applications from the widest range of applicants.

After applying, applicants will be sent a survey link to help us gather equal opportunities data which will inform Manchester Camerata's organisational development regarding its Diversity and Inclusion policy and objectives.

- Candidates are required to submit an audio-visual recording of the first-round excerpts. Audio will be extracted from the video before being presented to the panel to ensure candidates remain anonymous. The video must be submitted as an mp4 file, recorded in one take, not edited in any way, and clearly labelled with your name and the position you are applying for.
- In addition, please send a copy of your CV and a one page covering letter (which doesn't repeat information from your CV and outlines why you are interested in working with Manchester Camerata). Both files need to be saved as PDFs. Your CV and covering letter will only be shared with the panel if you advance to the second-round live auditions.

Audition Requirements

First-Round Excerpts - video submission:

- Brahms Symphony No. 4 in E minor, Op. 98 (Second movement, bars 64-71)
- Mendelssohn A Midsummer Night's Dream in E major, Op. 21 (Scherzo, Fig G K)
- Stravinsky Concerto in E-flat 'Dumbarton Oaks' (First movement, Beginning to 4th bar of Fig 5)
- Tchaikovsky Souvenir de Florence (First movement, bars 262 - 287)

Successful candidates from the first-round video submission will proceed to the second-round live audition.

Second-Round Live Audition – in person:

- Please prepare a movement of solo Bach PLUS a second piece of your choosing from any genre or style of music that you feel reflects your musical personality (the second piece can be any length, but the panel may stop you if required).
- Following your audition, there will be a short conversation with the panel and an opportunity to ask any questions you might have about Manchester Camerata and the work we do.
- O You're also invited to join some of our members in a short free improvisation, similar to how we might work in a creative music making session in schools or working with older people. A keyboard and some handheld percussion will be available if you would prefer not to improvise on your main instrument. Please note this section is not compulsory.





Other Information

- Please note that we are only able to accept applications from candidates who are eligible to live and work in the UK.
- The panel for both rounds will consist of section principals and members of the orchestra.
- You will receive an email from the Orchestra Personnel Manager with the outcome of your first-round video submission by Monday 22nd April.

- A pianist will be provided for the second-round live audition and will be available for rehearsal 10 minutes before.
