Audition Requirements

- Any movement from a Mozart/Haydn Concerto OR a Bach Solo Sonata/Partita
- PLUS a contrasting piece

Each applicant will be allocated 10 minutes to audition and an accompanist will be provided. You may bring your own pianist if you prefer.
